







INTERNATIONAL JAZZ DAY FACT SHEET

In November 2011, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) officially designated **April 30 as International Jazz Day** in order to highlight jazz and its diplomatic role of uniting people in all corners of the globe. Through this united effort, International Jazz Day is the one day each year that jazz is celebrated worldwide, bringing together people of all ages, backgrounds and nationalities in **195 countries**. Co-chaired by the UNESCO Director-General Audrey Azoulay and legendary jazz pianist Herbie Hancock, the day brings together communities, schools, and jazz enthusiasts around the world to learn about the history of jazz and its role in promoting peace, intercultural dialogue, and mutual understanding. The Herbie Hancock Institute of Jazz leads the annual celebration with education and outreach programs, community initiatives and events hosted by UNESCO and United Nations missions worldwide, including concerts, workshops, seminars and public performances.

How do I participate in International Jazz Day?

Participation is **completely free** and open to any person, organization, radio station, business, educational institution, or musical ensemble who wishes to celebrate jazz as a musical art form and force for good.

What can I do to participate?

- Present a jazz photo exhibition or film screening in your community.
